Dear Parents/Carers,

As you will be aware, the government is due to make an announcement soon regarding the UK's exit plan. We may have more information after this weekend regarding schools re-opening, and as always, I will keep you informed of any updates as they occur.

Home Learning

As promised, during our last communication, we have made new resources for you and your children to complete over the next few weeks. These resources are project/activity based and designed to consolidate learning across multiple subjects. We are very conscious that some families may not have completed the learning packs we have already sent out – and that is absolutely fine! I will continue to emphasise that we do not expect children to complete everything we send. It is at the discretion of parents/carers to decide on 'a best fit' approach and one that suits their current home life. As you will see there are lots of activities for the children to complete either on their own or with family and friends; much like the Easter activities sheets we provided you with. By organising work in this way it allows children time to finish off any of the resources in the learning packs at their own pace, whilst providing alternative activities to keep them engaged and happy – that is the most important aspect of our work during this lockdown period. I can assure you that when the schools re-open we will be working hard with every child to make up for any lost learning and to ensure they seamlessly get back into routines with the teachers that care dearly for them.


