Dear Parent/Carers

Happy New Year to you all! It has been wonderful to have the children back at Larks Hill and settling back into school life.

This letter contains all the necessary information for you and your child should expect from this term in Year 4.

Maths

Our sequence of learning in Maths follows the White Rose Maths schemes. We will continue to develop our understanding of multiplication and division. This will be followed by learning about length and perimeter and another unit on multiplication and division. By the end of Year 4 children are expected to be able to recall all the times table facts. Also in Year 4, pupils will undertake the statutory times table test so this will be a priority for us.

English

This term, writing will be focused around our book 'How To Train Your Dragon.' We will begin the term by writing a mythical story, followed by a newspaper report. The writing features will include fronted adverbials, direct speech and choosing the correct tense. With a new writing scheme in place in the Trust, another focus will be pupils independently revising and editing their own writing.



Science

This half-term we will study forces and magnets. Pupils will have the opportunity to investigate the strength of magnets as well as which surfaces create the most friction.

History

In History, children will learn about The Vikings. We will learn about what life was like for the Vikings, the justice system in Viking and Anglo-Saxon Britain and Vikings raids and invasions.

Computing

The focus for us this half term is to understand coding and use our knowledge of this to draw shapes and patterns.

Geography

We will be studying biomes in Geography this term. We will learn what a biome in and locate these on a map and be able to pick a biome to describe in detail.

Our PE lessons will be Monday and Tuesday afternoons. P.E. will be indoors on Monday and outdoors on Tuesday.

Art

This term, pupils will be studying the work of Aubrey Brown and create a mixed media piece of art of a dragon's eye.

Spanish

In Spanish we will learn all about families as well as introduce how to ask simple questions about our family and respond to these.

Design Technology

We will be planning, designing making our own levers and linking mechanism.

Music

In Music we will creating a composition using a range of notation.
