Maths

For maths, we will continue to follow the <u>White Rose</u> <u>Maths</u> schemes of learning. That means the topics that we will be learning about this half-term are fractions, time, statistics and position and direction. We will also continue to consolidate all the maths topics covered in our previous learning. Practising column addition and subtraction will remain a priority for Year 2 alongside 2s, 3s, 4s, 5s and 10 times tables.

English

Our writing will be based upon our class text of 'The Hunter' by Paul Gherghaty. We are writing a narrative at the start of the half term. We are also going to be writing a calligram poem in the shape of an animal. At the end of the half term, we are going to be writing diary entries from the viewpoint of Rosa Parks.

History

We will be studying Rosa Parks and Emily Davison and the impact of activism throughout the world. We are focusing on how change happens in history and where this fits onto a timeline.

Geography

For the first half term, our focus will be studying the countries of the United Kingdom and their capital cities. We will be creating comparisons between different cities in the world. In the second half-term, we will begin to look at the continents of the world and the oceans that surround them.

Science

This half term, we are beginning to learn about a variety of different habitats and how animals are adapted to live in their habitat. In the second halfterm we will be learning about plants and why they are useful to each habitat.
