




LKS2 (Year 3 and 4) Autumn Term One Curriculum Overview



Welcome to the Autumn Term. We very much hope that our children have been able to enjoy a wonderfully restful summer break and that they are raring to go as they commence another successful school year. As always, time flies and we are starting yet another school year. This curriculum overview contains information about what you and, more importantly, your child should expect in Year 3 and 4 this half-term. This term we have a new book: The Firework – Maker's Daughter that tells the story of Lila, a young girl who wants to become a firework maker and the journey she has to undertake to complete her apprenticeship!

Reading, Writing, Maths and Science

We are starting the new term with a brand-new text, 'The Firework-Maker's Daughter', which our curriculum will be centred around. In our writing lessons, we will be focusing on developing our spelling and grammar skills through writing. We will begin by writing a narrative around our text before moving onto an information text. In Maths lessons, Year 3 will be building upon their place value knowledge to understand numbers, whilst Year 4 will be understanding the place value of numbers before applying their place value knowledge to multiplication and division. In Science, we will be learning about rocks and their formations alongside fossils.

Class 3 will have Indoor PE on a Monday and Outdoor PE on a Tuesday. The children should bring their PE uniform on their classes PE day.

Class 4 will have Indoor PE on a Friday and Outdoor PE on a Thursday. The children should bring their PE uniform on their classes PE day.

Homework

Spellings will be given on Fridays with weekly tests on a Friday. Times tables should be practised using TTRockStars for at least 5 minutes, 3 times per week.

It is expected that children will read every day. Reading books will be checked and changed as necessary. Please remember to sign your child's reading record whenever you have listened to them read or discussed what they have read.

Other homework will be given as necessary to support in class learning. Homework is not intended to be onerous, so please let me know should there be difficulty in completing the given tacks.

How can I help my child?

You can help your child by supporting and encouraging them to complete their homework in a timely manner and to a high quality, in order to help them make progress and improve their scores each week.
