




UKS2 (Year 5 & 6) Autumn Term One Curriculum Overview



Welcome to the Autumn Term! We very much hope that our children have been able to enjoy a restful summer break and that they are raring to go as they start another successful school year. This curriculum overview contains information about what you and, more importantly, your child should expect in Year 5 and 6 this term. To start our new academic year, we have a new book: Cosmic.

Reading, Writing, Maths and Science

We are starting the new term with a brand-new text, 'Cosmic', which all our curriculum will be centred around. In our writing lessons, we will be focusing on developing our spelling and grammar skills through genre writing. We will begin by writing a letter of complaint, moving onto a persuasive leaflet; all based around the themes and characters of 'Cosmic'. In Maths lessons, Year 5 will be building upon their place value knowledge to understand negative numbers and rounding, whilst Year 6 will be understanding the place value of numbers up to 1 million before applying their place value knowledge to multiplication and division. In Science, we will be learning about the Solar System, including the features of the main planets, how the Earth orbits the Sun and importance of light and dark within the universe. We will be focusing on using scientific vocabulary to describe out-of-this-world concepts and debate scientific space theories.

Class 5 will have Indoor PE on a Tuesday and Swimming on a Thursday. The children should bring their PE uniform on their classes PE day and their swimming kit on their swimming day.

Class 6 will have Indoor and Outdoor PE on a Wednesday. The children should bring their PE uniform on their classes PE day.

Homework

Spellings will be given at the start of the half-term with weekly tests on a Friday. Times tables should be practised using TTRockstars for at least 5 minutes, 3 times per week.

It is expected that children will read at home for every school day. Reading books will be checked and changed as necessary. Please remember to sign your child's reading record whenever you have listened to them read or discussed what they have read.

Other homework will be given as necessary to support in class learning. Homework is not intended to be onerous, so please let me know should there be difficulty in completing the given
